Steele Clinches RNC Chairmanship

After six rounds of voting, recent Shepperd Distinguished Lecture guest, Michael Steele, is taking the reigns of the Republican National Committee. Steele defeated five other nominees for the position, including incumbent Robert "Mike" Duncan. Capturing the crowd's excitement, Steele professed, "This is awesome," in his victory speech. Steele was virtually counted out of the running as an RNC outsider; however, the 168 member delegation clearly signaled its desire for change with his election.

In a nineteen page "blueprint" Steele outlined his plan for expanding his party's reach. "We're going to say to friend and foe alike: 'We want you to be a part of us, we want you to be with us.' And for those who wish to obstruct, get ready to get knocked over," Steele said. Key elements of Steele's plan include updating party strategy specifically to better harness available technology. During his bid for the chairmanship, Steele referred to President Obama's monumentally successful fundraising efforts via the internet. Steele's own grassroots campaign website linked to numerous popular social networking sites including *Facebook*, *YouTube* and *Twitter*. Illustrating his stance for change, Steele declared, "This is the dawn of a new party moving in a new direction with strength and conviction."
