

Rep. Tom Craddick and Renee Henderson Earls Named Outstanding State and Local Leader Award Winners

Each year the John Ben Shepperd Public Leadership Forum honors two outstanding leaders at the annual Texas Leadership Forum. Nominations are submitted through an open nomination process, and recipients are chosen by an independent panel of judges. This year's presentation will be held on Thursday, January 13, 2011, at the Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum. At only 25 years old, Tom Craddick decided to seek office in the Texas House of Representatives as a Republican from his hometown of Midland. At

the time, Texas was a one-party state, and many thought him foolhardy. Craddick proved them wrong and was elected as one of only nine Republicans in the 150-seat House.

In 1971 he gained respect from both sides when he joined a bipartisan group of reformists dubbed "The Dirty 30" that pushed for changes in House Ethics. In 1975, Speaker Bill Clayton appointed Craddick first Republican as the committee chairman in 100 years. On January 11, 2003, he again made state history when, subsequent to his 34-year tenure in the House, he became the first Republican Speaker in more than 130 years. Craddick served as Speaker from January 2003 – January 2009. During that time, Texas went from a \$10 billion budget shortfall to a \$10 billion budget surplus, and the legislature passed landmark tort reform, reducing frivolous medical malpractice lawsuits, resulting in more doctors moving to Texas, expanding access to health care.

Craddick holds both a Bachelor of Business Administration and a Master of Business Administration from Texas Tech University. Craddick married the former Nadine Nayfa, a native of Sweetwater, in 1969. They have two children, Christi and Thomas Russell, Jr., and two grandchildren, Tripp and Claire. Some are born leaders. Others are made. Renee Henderson Earls is both. Renee's enthusiasm and her passion make people want to follow her. Experience has given her wisdom, insight,

and vision - and that, too, makes people willing to follow her. In her vast experience in community organizations and projects, she has been either a member, President, or Chair of the Junior League of Odessa, following: Odessa Chamber of Commerce, Main Street Odessa, 1st Christian Church Board, Girl Scouts of the Permian Basin, Heritage of Odessa, Odessa American, American State Bank, Midland/Odessa Symphony & Chorale, Crystal Ball Foundation, Odessa College Foundation, ECISD Education Foundation, TTUHSC Laura W. Bush Institute for Women's Health and Odessa LINKS

In addition to her extensive volunteer work, she is active in her church, owns **The Odessan** magazine, works full time in the health care field, and is a wife and mother.

A native of Odessa, Renee graduated from Texas Tech with a degree in Broadcast Journalism. She and her husband, Rich, have an 11 year-old son, Preston, and she has two stepchildren—Morgan and Mitchell.

She states that her motto for a successful life is:"Whatever thy hand finds to do; do it with all thy might." Certainly she is the personification of just that motto.
